

## Fall Semester 2007 Registration/Academic Calendar

**NOTE:** Any student who completes registration agrees to pay the University of Colorado at Boulder all charges on your account when due. (See bursar's [tuition and fee information](#))

March 19-29 (Mon.-Sun.)	Fall 2007 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See <a href="#">Course Reservation</a> )
April 2-29 (Mon.-Sun.)	Fall 2007 registration time assignments for students enrolled during spring 2007. For best course selection, register as soon as possible after your time assignment begins. Continuing students can register through June 1 (and also August 6-17).
April 30 (Mon.) – June 1 (Fri.)	<b>Schedule adjustment for continuing degree students who have registered for fall semester and registration for continuing students who have not yet registered. AFTER June 1, continuing students may NOT register or adjust their schedules UNTIL August 6-17.</b>  Fall 2007 registration for eligible new graduate students and readmitted students who have confirmed with admissions and eligible students continuing from summer to fall. <b>After June 1, readmitted students may not register or adjust their schedules until August 6-17.</b>
June 4 (Mon.) – August 3 (Fri.)	Fall 2007 registration for incoming freshman and transfer students ( <i>on specified dates</i> ). Continuing students and readmitted undergraduate students may not register or adjust their schedules until August 6-17.  Registration continues ( <i>on specified dates</i> ) for new graduate students and eligible students continuing from summer to fall.
August 3 (Fri.)	<b>Deadline</b> to update your billing and permanent addresses to ensure that your fall 2007 bill is mailed to the correct address.
August 6-17 (Mon.-Fri.)	Final registration and schedule adjustment for continuing students, new admitted graduate students and readmitted students who have confirmed, as well as eligible students continuing from summer to fall.  Final registration period for all incoming freshman and transfer students who have not previously registered (except those in arts and sciences and journalism attending the final orientation in August) and schedule adjustment for all transfers students who registered in June, July, or early August.
August 6-20 (Mon.-Mon.)	Bills mailed to the billing addresses of all students who register by August 17 (mailed on Mondays to all students who registered by the previous Friday). If no billing address is on record, bills are mailed to the permanent address. (Due on September 5.)
August 17 (Fri.)	<b>Deadline (midnight) for all students to register for fall courses (except incoming freshmen and transfers in arts and sciences and journalism attending the final orientation and any other incoming freshman or transfers student not yet registered). Registration must be completed by midnight on this day to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester.</b> After this date, registration is on a space-available basis, and a <b>\$50 late fee</b> is charged. (See <a href="#">Late Registration</a> )  <b>Deadline (midnight) for continuing students to withdraw from the university and receive a full refund of the \$200 enrollment deposit, less any outstanding charges.</b> (This deadline to withdraw and not forfeit the deposit also applies to students planning to go on the Time Out Program.) New and readmitted students are not eligible for a refund. (See <a href="#">Withdrawal</a> )
August 20-21 (Mon.-Tues.)	Registration for incoming transfer students in arts and sciences and journalism who are attending the final transfer orientation on August 20. All other eligible incoming transfers who have not yet registered can register via the Web on Tuesday, August 21, 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.
August 23 (Thurs.)	Registration for incoming freshman students in arts and sciences and journalism who are attending the final freshman orientation on August 21-23 as well as registration for all other eligible incoming freshmen and transfers who have not yet registered. <b>These students must complete registration by 5:00 p.m. on this day to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester.</b> After this date, registration is on a space-available basis, and a <b>\$50 late fee</b> is charged. (See <a href="#">Late Registration</a> )
August 24 (Fri.)	<b>Drop/add time assignments begin for all incoming freshman and transfer students.</b> (See <a href="#">Drop/Add</a> )  ACCESS registration begins. (See <a href="#">ACCESS</a> )  Bills mailed to the billing addresses all students who register August 18-23. If no billing address is on record, bills are mailed to the mailing address.

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August 26 (Sun.)	Drop/add time assignments begin for all other students . (See <a href="#">Drop/Add</a> )  Faculty/staff registration begins.
August 27 (Mon.)	<b>Classes begin.</b>
September 3 (Mon.)	Labor Day holiday. No classes. University closed.
September 4-5 (Tues.-Wed.)	Space-available registration for Senior Citizens Auditors Program, Koenig Alumni Center , 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.; continues on Wednesday, September 5, 9:00 a.m. to noon. (See <a href="#">Other Types of Registration</a> )
September 5 (Wed.)	<p><b>Add Deadline : Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to add a course</b>, including independent study and thesis, without the instructor's signature. <i>After this date, the instructor's signature is required on a special action form to add a course (through September 14).</i> <b>NOTE:</b> After 5:00 p.m. on this date, web registration is only available for dropping courses (through 5:00 p.m. on September 12, the drop deadline). (See <a href="#">Drop/Add</a>)</p> <p><b>Wait List Deadline: Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to add name to a course wait list.</b> (See <a href="#">Wait Lists</a>)</p> <p><b>Tuition &amp; Fees Payment Deadlines: Deadline to pay full tuition and fees (or first payment of two-payment plan). Due by close of bursar's office business day. If paid in person or mailed, or before midnight using the internet payment option.</b> No grace period. (See the bursar billing channel on CUConnect under the financial tab or <a href="#">Tuition and Fees</a>)</p> <p><b>Deadline</b> to sign up for the two-payment plan before midnight via CUConnect. No grace period.</p> <p><b>Deadline</b> (5:00 p.m.) to select or waive university sponsored health insurance at Wardenburg Health Center or by midnight on CUConnect.</p> <p><b>Deadline</b> (5:00 p.m.) for private scholarship checks to be received in the financial aid Scholarship Office to avoid late and service charges.</p>
September 12 (Wed.)	<p><b>Drop Deadline: Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course</b> without being assessed tuition and fees for that course and without a W grade appearing on the transcript. <b>NOTE:</b> After this date, the instructor's signature is required on a special action form (through October 10) to drop a course. ( EXCEPTION: Students whose only college is arts and sciences, as well as nondegree students, have until November 2 to drop a course without approval signatures.) No refunds for tuition or fees are given for courses dropped after September 12. (See <a href="#">Drop/Add</a>)</p> <p><b>Deadline</b> (5:00 p.m.) to petition to waive UCSU student fees.</p> <p><b>Deadline</b> to request a refund of any student opportunities fees you selected. (See <a href="#">Student Opportunities Fees</a>)</p> <p><b>Deadline</b> (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed a \$200 withdrawal processing fee. After this date, 100 percent of tuition and fees is due for student who withdraw unless there are extenuating circumstances. (See <a href="#">Withdrawal</a>)</p>
September 14 (Fri.)	<p><b>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to add a course without petitioning your dean.</b> <b>NOTE :</b> Instructors' signature is required on a special action form to add a course. In general, instructors only approve an add if students have been regularly attending and there's space in the course. (See <a href="#">Drop/Add</a>) (NOTE: September 14 is also the deadline for undergraduate resident students to add a course and be eligible for the COF voucher for that course. See <a href="#">COF</a>)</p> <p><b>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to change variable-credit hours, pass/fail, and no-credit status on courses</b> without petitioning your dean. After the deadline, petitions will only be accepted if there are extenuating circumstances. (See <a href="#">Credit and Grading Options</a>)</p>
September 26 (Wed.)	<b>Deadline</b> (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and be eligible to petition to be assessed 40 percent of full tuition and fees (instead of being assessed 100 percent of full tuition and fees). (See <a href="#">Withdrawal</a> )

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<b>October 5 (Fri.)</b>	<b>Deadline</b> for students who have three or more final exams on the same day for fall semester to make arrangements to change their final exam schedule. (See <a href="#">Calendars and Schedules</a> )
<b>October 10 (Wed.)</b>	<p><b>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course without petitioning the dean's office.</b> EXCEPTION: Students whose only college is arts and sciences, as well as nondegree students, have until November 2 to drop a course without approval signatures.) <b>Note:</b> Courses dropped after September 12 appear with a W grade on the transcript and no refunds for tuition or fees are given for course drops after September 12. (See <a href="#">Drop/Add</a>)</p> <p><b>Deadline</b> to pay unpaid balance (including two-payment plan). Due 5:00 p.m. if paid in person or mailed, or before midnight using the internet payment option. No grace period. (See bursar channel under the financial tab in CUConnect or Tuition and Fees)</p> <p><b>Deadline</b> (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and be eligible to petition to be assessed 60 percent of full tuition and fees (instead of being assessed 100 percent of full tuition and fees). (See <a href="#">Withdrawal</a>)</p> <p><b>Deadline</b> (5:00 p.m.) to turn in Time Out Program (TOP) applications to the registrar's office and be assured a continuing student registration time assignment for spring semester 2008. (See <a href="#">Time Out Program</a>)</p>
<b>October 17 (Wed.)</b>	Spring 2008 course listings available on the Web ( <i>tentative date</i> ).
<b>October 29 (Mon.) – November 2 (Fri.)</b>	Spring 2008 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See <a href="#">Course Reservation</a> )
<b>November 5 (Mon.) – December 2 (Sun.)</b>	Spring 2008 registration period for continuing degree students enrolled during fall 2007.
<b>November 19-21 (Mon.-Wed.)</b>	Fall Break. No classes. University remains open.
<b>November 22-23 (Thurs.-Fri.)</b>	Thanksgiving holiday. No classes. University closed.
<b>December 1 (Sat.)</b>	Deadline (midnight) for students paying in-state tuition to authorize COF online for fall semester 2007 and receive the COF tuition voucher. After this date students can still authorize through December 20, but need to come into the Office of the Registrar in Regent 105 to do so. (See <a href="#">COF</a> )
<b>December 3 (Mon.)</b>	Spring 2008 registration begins for eligible new and readmitted students.
<b>December 14 (Fri.)</b>	<p>Last day of classes for fall 2007.</p> <p>Last day for students to withdraw from the university for fall semester. Students in the colleges/schools of Architecture, Education, Engineering, Journalism, Law, MBA and Music must have their dean's permission to withdraw. (See <a href="#">Withdrawal</a>)</p> <p>Last day for students to turn in Time Out Program (TOP) applications to the registrar's office for fall semester. (See <a href="#">Time Out Program</a>)</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to submit an application for the Course Repetition program for spring semester. (See <a href="#">Course Repetition</a>)</p>
<b>December 15-20 (Sat.-Thurs.)</b>	Final exams for fall 2007. (There are no exams on Sunday, December 16.) (See <a href="#">Calendars and Schedules</a> )
<b>December 20 (Thurs.)</b>	<p>Last day to dispute tuition and fee charges for fall withdrawals. (See <a href="#">Tuition Dispute</a>)</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) for students paying in-state tuition to authorize COF for fall semester 2007 and receive the COF tuition voucher. Students can authorize COF at the Office of the Registrar in Regent 105. (See <a href="#">COF</a>)</p>
<b>December 21 (Fri.)</b>	Fall 2007 commencement, Coors Events/Conference Center, 9:30 a.m.

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<b>January 14 (Mon.)</b>	Spring 2008 classes begin.
<b>January 21 (Mon.)</b>	Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday. No classes. University closed.
<b>January 23 (Wed.)</b>	Spring 2008 tuition and fee payment due date.
<b>March 24-28 (Mon.-Fri.)</b>	Spring break. No classes. University closed on Friday.
<b>May 2 (Fri.)</b>	Last day of classes for spring 2008.
<b>May 3-8 (Sat.-Thurs.)</b>	Final exams for spring 2008. (There are no exams on Sunday, May 4.)
<b>May 9 (Fri.)</b>	Spring 2008 commencement, Folsom Stadium, 8:30 a.m.
