## Registration/Academic Calendar

Any student who completes registration agrees to pay the University of Colorado at Boulder according to the payment terms documented in the *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* under the Paying Your Bill section.

### OCTOBER 25 - 29 (MON. - FRI.)

- Spring 2000 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See page 40 of the *Fall 1999 Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* for eligibility requirements.)

### NOVEMBER 1 - 28 (MON. - SUN.)

- Spring 2000 registration time assignments for students enrolled during fall 1999. For best course selection, register as soon as possible after your time assignment begins. Continuing students can register through January 13.

### NOVEMBER 29 (MON.) - JANUARY 13 (THURS.)

- Schedule adjustment for continuing degree students who have completed registration for spring semester and registration for continuing students who have not yet registered.
- Spring 2000 registration for new and readmitted students not required to attend an orientation.

### DECEMBER 10 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** to update your permanent address to ensure that your spring 2000 schedule/bill is mailed to the correct address.

### DECEMBER 13 (MON.)

- Spring 2000 schedule/bills mailed to the permanent address of all students who register by December 10.

### DECEMBER 20 (MON.)

- Spring 2000 schedule/bills mailed to the permanent address of all students who register December 12-17.

### DECEMBER 28 (TUES.)

- **Deadline** to register and receive a schedule/bill in the mail.

### DECEMBER 29 (WED.)

Spring 2000 schedule bills mailed to the permanent address of all students who register December 19-28.

### JANUARY 7 (FRI.)

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) for continuing students to withdraw from the university and receive a **full refund** of the \$200 enrollment deposit, less any outstanding charges. (This deadline to withdraw and not forfeit the deposit applies to students planning to go on the Time Out Program as well.) New and readmitted students are not eligible for a refund. (See page 39.)

### JANUARY 13 (THURS.)

- **Deadline** for all students, both undergraduate and graduate, to register for spring courses. **Registration must be completed by 6:00 p.m. to be guaranteed enrollment for spring semester.** After this date, registration is on a space-available basis, and a **\$50 late fee** is charged. (See page 38 for late-registration information.)

### JANUARY 14 (FRI.)

- Schedule/bill distribution for students who registered after December 17, for students who did not receive a schedule/bill in the mail, and for students who need a revised schedule/bill, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. in Regent Administrative Center.

- Drop/add time assignments begin. (See page 19.)

- ACCESS registration begins. (See page 37.)

### JANUARY 16 (SUN.)

- Drop/add time assignments continue. (See page 19.)

### JANUARY 17 (MON.)

Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday. No classes. University closed.

### JANUARY 18 (TUES.)

- Classes begin.

### JANUARY 24 (MON.)

- Space-available registration for Senior Citizens Auditors Program, Koenig Alumni Center, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.; continues on Tuesday, January 25, 9:00 a.m. to noon. (See page 39.)

### JANUARY 26 (WED.)

#### Add Deadline:

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to add a course, including independent study and thesis, without the instructor's signature. *After this date, you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form to add a course (through February 4).* **NOTE:** After 5:00 p.m., CU Connect and web registration are only available for dropping courses (through 5:00 p.m. on February 2, the drop deadline). (See page 20.)

#### Wait List Deadline:

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to add your name to a course wait list. (See page 20.)

#### Tuition Payment Deadline:

- **Deadline** (6:00 p.m.) to pay full tuition and fees and to turn in a deferred tuition agreement. **No grace period.** (See pages 31-32.)

- **Deadline** (6:00 p.m.) to waive university-sponsored health insurance at Wardenburg Health Center.

- **Deadline** (6:00 p.m.) to waive UCSU student fees.

- **Deadline** to request refund of any student opportunities fees you selected. (See page 10-11.)

- **Deadline** (6:00 p.m.) for private scholarship checks to be received in the financial aid scholarship office to avoid late and service charges.

### FEBRUARY 2 (WED.)

#### Drop Deadline:

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course without the instructor's signature, without being assessed tuition and fees for that course, and without a *W* appearing on your transcript. *After this date, you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form and you must be passing your course to drop it.* (See page 20.)

- **Deadline** (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed \$200 in tuition and fees. (See pages 39-40.)

**FEBRUARY 4 (FRI.)**

- **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to add a course without petitioning your dean.** NOTE: Instructor's signature is required on a special action form to add a course. In general, instructors will only approve an add if you've been regularly attending and there's space in the course. (See page 20.)
- **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to change variable-credit hours, and pass/fail and no-credit status on courses.** (See page 20.)

**FEBRUARY 16 (WED.)**

- **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed 40 percent of full tuition and fees.** (See pages 39-40.)

**FEBRUARY 25 (FRI.)**

- **Deadline** for students who have three or more final exams on the same day to make arrangements to change their final exam schedule. (See page 5.)

**MARCH 1 (WED.)**

- **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course without petitioning your dean.** (See page 20.)
- **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed 60 percent of full tuition and fees.** After this day, 100 percent of tuition and fees is due. (See pages 39-40.)
- **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to pay any unpaid balance, including approved deferred tuition. No grace period.**
- **Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to turn in Time Out Program (TOP) applications to the registrar's office.** (See page 41.)

**MARCH 6 - 10 (MON. - FRI.)**

- Distribution of the *Summer Session 2000 Catalog and the Fall 2000 Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* in Regent foyer, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (except Monday, March 6, until 6:00 p.m.) and UMC 155, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Beginning Monday, March 13, distribution is in Regent 105.

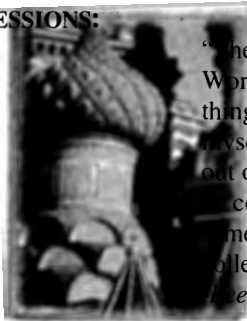

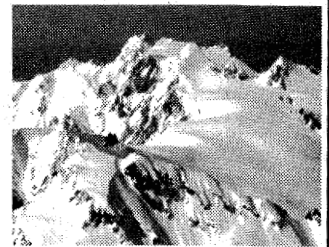

## On the Cover of this Handbook

The cover of the Spring 2000 RHSC is a composite of the artist's rendition and photographs of the Earth Day 2000 "Achievement Tree" currently on display in the northeast entrance of the UMC. This tree has been constructed to acknowledge the dedication and efforts of departments on campus who have pledged to reduce their impact on our environment. On its branches hang hundreds of leaves. Each leaf represents the accomplishment of a department's goal. Cumulatively, these Earth Day 2000 initiatives illustrate that the vision of a healthy, sustainable campus can become a reality.

Since 1970, Earth Day has been a day of celebration, reflection, and action towards the preservation of our global environment. CU-Boulder has a long tradition of teaching environmental and social responsibility to students and continues to be a national leader in campus environmentalism. With the coming of Earth Day 2000 our roles as stewards of the environment and the larger mission of graduating citizens prepared to deal with critical issues of the 21<sup>st</sup> century are being reassessed.

Over 20 service and academic departments have pledged to reduce their environmental impact by April 22, 2000. A few examples of their ambitious yet feasible goals are:

- ☒ The Recreation Center embarking on the process of evaluating and changing their current energy uses to energy saving practices.
- ☒ Transportation Services upgrading their buses with bike racks.
- ☒ Facilities Management pursuing construction debris recycling.
- ☒ Environmental Health & Safety starting a program for chemical redistribution and their website links to information on less toxic chemical substitutes.

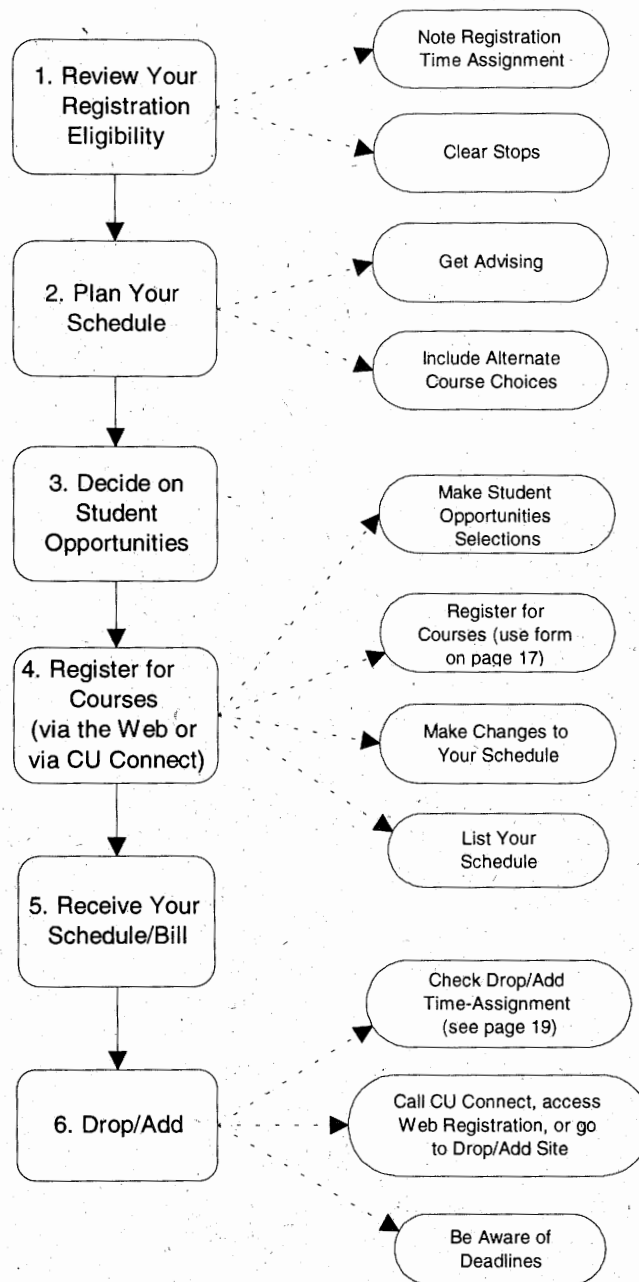
The Earth Day 2000 "Achievement Tree" serves as a symbolic representation of our ability to create a sustainable society.

This *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* (RHSC) contains information you need to register for the spring 2000 semester, adjust your schedule, and pay your bill. If policies or procedures change, you will receive further information.

The requirements, policies, and course descriptions of each college and school are printed in the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*. You are responsible for knowing and following the catalog policies for your year of entry into a specific program at CU-Boulder.

Although this handbook was prepared on the basis of the best information available at the time of its printing (September 29, 1999), all information is subject to change.

**The University of Colorado at Boulder has a strong institutional commitment to the principles of diversity and takes affirmative action to achieve that end. ## Registration

You can call CU Connect (our telephone registration system) or access web registration to register for courses, drop and add courses, and sign up for course wait lists. When you register, you receive immediate confirmation or denial of your enrollment in courses.

**Registration Deadline** - All students must complete registration by **6:00 p.m. on January 13, 2000** to be guaranteed enrollment for spring semester 2000. Students who do not register by this date (including graduate students) are subject to late registration and a **\$50 late fee**.

**NOTE: If you require accommodations because of a disability, notify the Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 20, Boulder, CO 80309-0020, or call 303-492-4822. If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call 303-492-5841 (TTY).**

### 1 Review Your Registration Eligibility

#### Currently enrolled students:

You can access your spring semester 2000 registration eligibility (including your registration time assignment) in the following ways:

**NEW!! - View your registration eligibility status via web registration.** You may view your registration time assignment and whether you have any stops that need to be cleared by checking your registration status via web registration. To access this information, go to PLUS on the web at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus> and select the "Registration" button and then log on to web registration by entering your student ID number and your PIN (Personal Identification Number). Select the "Registrar Status" tab at the bottom of the screen to view your eligibility to register for spring semester 2000 (including any stops currently on your record) as well as your registration time assignment. **NOTE:** Because registration eligibility information is available via web registration, we will not post invitations to register on PLUS or send them via e-mail.

• **Come to the registrar's office** for a copy of your invitation to register.

#### All new and readmitted students:

You'll receive a personalized invitation to register in the mail (mailed to your mailing address) or at orientation (if required).

Your invitation to register includes your PIN. Your PIN, in combination with your student number, allows you to access web registration, CU Connect (our telephone registration system), the Personal Look-Up Services (PLUS) on the web and the financial aid telephone system. Certain data specific to you is available on these systems, and your PIN controls access to this information. Your PIN is a randomly set number and must be kept confidential. **Be sure to memorize your PIN as it remains the same throughout your career at CU-Boulder.**

If you feel that your PIN is not secure and you wish to change it, you can change it via PLUS or come in to the registrar's office in Regent 105.

If you forget your PIN, you can call the registrar's office at 303-492-6970 or come in to the office in Regent 105.

#### Your registration eligibility via web registration or your invitation to register includes:

• **Your registration time assignment** - This is the date and time you can register for courses. You can register any time after your time assignment begins through the registration deadline (see the registration/academic calendar for specific dates). It is to your advantage to register as soon as possible after your registration time assignment begins. You can also call CU Connect at 303-938-8110 or check your registration status on the web to find out your registration time assignment. **(If using CU Connect, enter 001 for the spring semester term code when prompted.)**

**Registration time assignments for undergraduate continuing students** are based on the total number of hours completed at CU (any campus), transfer credit, and any courses you are currently enrolled in (as of September 24).

Graduating seniors receive the earliest assignments. All other seniors register next, then graduate and law students, first-semester freshmen (those with 12 or fewer hours), juniors, sophomores, and then second-semester freshmen. Within these groups, time assignments are random.

Freshmen .....	0-29 hours
Sophomores .....	30-59 hours
Juniors .....	60-89 hours
Seniors .....	90-123 hours
5th Year Seniors .....	124 hours and above

- **Advising notice** - If required by your college or school, consult with an advisor before registering. See page 34 for more information.
- **Other stops** - Stops are holds that the university puts on student records for various reasons. Stops may originate from delinquent financial obligations, academic concerns, or even disciplinary matters. If you have any stops on your record, you are not allowed to register until you have cleared them all. Be sure to clear all stops at least 24 hours before your registration time assignment.

### 2 Plan Your Schedule

Use the schedule planning worksheet on page 13 to fill out a preliminary schedule for spring 2000. Then, fill out the registration form on page 17 before registering. It is a good idea to include alternate course choices on your registration form in case courses you request are full. Refer to page 15 under "searching for courses" for information about the schedule planner tool on the web and course availability.

### 3 Decide on Student Opportunities

In addition to the mandatory fees you must pay along with your tuition, there is a group of student opportunities available to you for which optional fees are charged. The opportunities consist of various services provided by the

university, tickets for concerts, plays, and the like, and club and student groups in which you can participate or merely provide money for their use.

When you first access registration (either via CU Connect or the web), you will be given a brief description of the student opportunities fees available to you and be prompted to choose (or not) each opportunity. After you've made your choices, you'll be prompted to confirm them. With this step completed, you can register for classes.

The student opportunities you have chosen will appear on your tuition and fee bill. If you want to change any of the student opportunities originally chosen, you **cannot** do so via CU Connect or the web. Instead, you must call the appropriate office at the phone number listed below.

**Refunds will be given up to the first tuition payment deadline (January 26).**

#### DESCRIPTIONS OF STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES FEES

Following are descriptions of all the opportunities available to you, including the fee for each opportunity.

Free, year-round services provided by **Career Services** in Willard Hall include career counseling, career-planning and job-search workshops, the career library, video practice interviews, and the *Discover* computerized career-guidance system. Two additional services available for a fee are listed below. (**Note:** The cost of these two services for Business majors are paid through their student fees.)

#### **Career Connections ..... \$35.00**

For students graduating by August 2000. The prime time to use Career Connections is during your final year at CU. During the semester connect with employers seeking college graduates by taking advantage of weekly interviewing opportunities, having your resume referred to employers, obtaining employment vacancies, and networking with employers. *To complete your registration for this service, view a web orientation or attend a presentation during the first week of class. View the Career Services website at <http://www.colorado.edu/careerservices> for more information.* 303-492-4100.

#### **Cooperative Education and Internships ..... \$55.00**

For undergraduate and graduate students seeking work experience before graduation. Each year, more than 7,000 internships are available in a variety of organizations in business, engineering, art museums, social service agencies, and environmental and governmental agencies. Contact the Co-op Office (Willard 18) early in the semester to complete necessary materials. Full refunds are granted until the drop/add deadline. This service is good for 12 months from enrollment. 303-492-4129.

#### **Club Sports ..... \$4.75**

Club sports, which are partially funded by student fees, often require participants to pay out-of-pocket expenses which may limit their involvement in the sport. This fee helps support club sports, so there are fewer out-of-pocket expenses for the participants, and it also offsets some of the overhead costs of the sports. There are currently over 30 club sports programs, with athletes

competing in local, intercollegiate, regional, and sometimes national competitions. Coed sports funded include: bicycle racing, equestrian, fencing, field hockey, figure skating, fly fishing, in-line hockey, kayaking, racquetball, rodeo, running, speed skating, squash, tae kwon do, triathlon, and waterpolo. Men's sports are: baseball, diving, ice hockey, lacrosse, rugby, soccer, swimming, ultimate frisbee, and volleyball. Women's sports are: dance, diving, ice hockey, lacrosse, rugby, soccer, softball, swimming, ultimate frisbee, and volleyball. 303-492-5471.

#### **College of Music Concert Card ..... \$30.00 per card**

The hot sounds of jazz! International dance! The classical repertoire! The best of musical theatre and opera! Each concert card gives you \$60 worth of Artist Series and Lyric Theatre tickets for only \$30—a 50% savings over single ticket prices! Cards are valid for the entire 1999-2000 season and let you choose from a variety of performances. Concert cards give you the flexibility to decide what concerts to attend and where you would like to sit. All you have to do is present your card at the box office when choosing tickets. *Concert cards will not be mailed to you.* Bring your student ID and proof of payment to Imig Music C103 to pick up your College of Music Concert Card. 303-492-8008.

#### **Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender**

#### **Resource Center ..... \$5.00**

The Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender (GLBT) Resource Center serves as a central clearing house for information about gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender issues. Open to all regardless of sexual orientation, the center provides resources; information dissemination and referral; and educational, cultural, and social programming including LesBiGayTrans Awareness Month and the Lambda Rising GLBT Studies conference. Although a department within the Division of Student Affairs, the GLBT Resource Center receives no state general funds or other student fee money. Fees will fund the center's programming, and contributors will have the option to receive *CU Out & About: A Publication of the Lesbian, Bisexual, Gay and Transgender Community at the University of Colorado at Boulder* and supplemental events calendars. Call 303-492-1377 for more information or stop by Willard 334.

#### **Student Groups ..... \$4.95**

This fee supports student groups on campus through the Student Organizations Committee. You can register using the following methods (or a combination of the following methods):

**Telephone Registration** - Call CU Connect, 303-938-8110, from any touch-tone phone to register. Follow the instructions on the registration form on page 17 and use the function codes listed on page 16. You may call any time after your time assignment begins. **After registering via CU Connect, list your classes by pressing 5# to verify your schedule.**

**Registration via the web - NEW!** First complete the registration form on page 17. Then go to PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus/> and select the "Registration" button. Follow the instructions shown on the web registration pages. Be sure to verify your schedule via the web when you're done registering.

CU Connect and web registration are normally available Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to midnight, and on Sundays from 11:00 a.m. to midnight. (See page 16 for exceptions.)

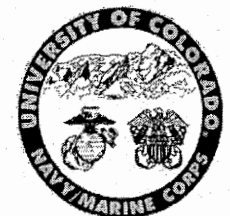
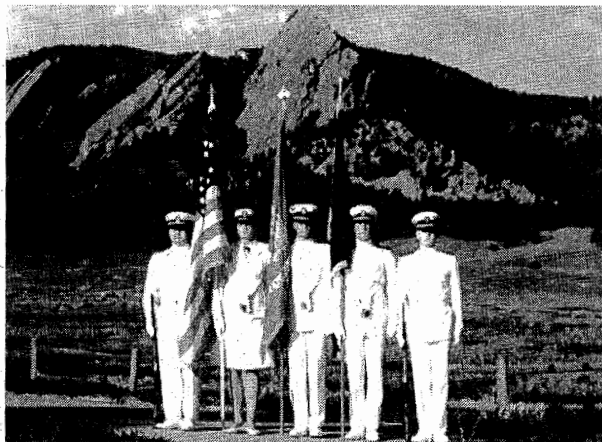

Once you have registered, make adjustments to your schedule either via CU Connect or the web through the **registration deadline, 6:00 p.m. on January 13.**

After this date, see pages 19-20 for instructions on making final schedule adjustments during the drop/add period.

### LINKED COURSES

Linked courses are lecture courses that have required recitations and/or labs. In the course listings, you can identify a linked course because *the call numbers for linked lectures are not listed*. Only the call numbers for the linked recitation or lab are listed. (For courses that have a required lecture, recitation, and a lab, the call numbers are *not listed* for the lecture and recitation; they are *only listed* for the lab.)

**NOTE:** This does not apply to courses that have a required lab with a different course number, *e.g.*, EPOB 1210 General Biology 1 and EPOB 1230 General Biology Lab 1. To register for linked courses, enter the call number for the lab or recitation only. When you enter the call number, the system automatically "links" all other sections of the course and either enrolls you in all sections of the course or gives you the option of placing your name on a wait list, if available, for all linked sections of the course.

### CONTROLLED ENROLLMENT COURSES

Controlled enrollment sections of a course are ones that have specific restrictions placed by the department that offers the course. They have a section number between 700 and 999. The call numbers are not published for controlled enrollment sections. To find out if you qualify for a controlled enrollment section, contact the department that offers the course. If you are eligible, the department will either enroll you in the course or give you the call number so you can register for the course via the web or via CU Connect.

### SEARCHING FOR COURSES

You may need to search for a new section of a course for the following reasons:

- Sometimes academic departments must change the time a course is offered *after the Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* has been published. When this happens, the department cancels the original section and adds a new section that reflects the time change.
- The section you request is full.

**You can search for available sections in the following ways:**

- The **schedule planner** is a tool to find out about course availability as well as additional course information. Using this feature, you can also search for courses by subject, core requirements, and by meeting time. When a course is displayed, you can access the course description, required books, and student ratings of the course. In addition, you can map out your schedule to show when you have courses and other scheduled commitments, such as work. *The schedule planner is updated on a daily basis during registration periods, so it is a good planning source, but*

*does not display up-to-the-minute course availability. You can access the schedule planner feature via PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>.*

- You can conduct on-line course searches via web registration. The **web registration course search tool** allows you to search by subject, level, course number, core requirements, and by meeting time. The course search is updated on a real-time basis, so if you find a course you would like to sign up for, you immediately know whether there is still room in the course. Also, if you try to **register for a course via web registration but you're denied the course** (due to the section being closed or cancelled), you can conduct a **section search** to see if there are any available sections of that same course that fit in with your schedule. When you're denied a course, click on the word "search" next to the course and then click on the "submit" button. If there are any available sections of the course that fit your schedule, you'll be given the option to add the course (just click on the "add" button for the section you want.) You can access web registration via PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>.

- If you request a course section that is full **via CU Connect**, the computer voice asks you if you want to conduct a **search for other open sections of that course**. If you do, press **7#** when prompted. CU Connect will search for other sections of the course that are available and that will fit your schedule. If another section is available, you can register for that section.

- **A list of available courses** can be found in Regent 105.

### WAIT LISTS

Throughout the registration and drop/add periods, if you are eligible to take a course but find it is full, you may be able to put your name on a computerized wait list. Each department determines if a wait list will be offered for a course and what type of wait list will be used. There are two types of wait lists:

- *Automatic wait lists* are set up on a first-come, first-served basis. As a vacancy occurs in a class, the person at the top of the list is automatically enrolled.
- *Resequenced wait lists* use a priority system to determine who enrolls in a course as spaces open up. Priorities are established by the department and are usually based on class standing and/or major.

CU Connect and web registration informs you if a class you have requested has a wait list and gives you the option of adding your name to the list. On CU Connect, press **9#** when prompted and listen for verification. On the web, select the wait list option and then select "submit" and wait for verification. **NOTE:** CU Connect and web registration do **not** tell you what type of wait list is used for the course.

When you place your name on a wait list, the number of students already on the list is announced. As wait-list positions constantly change during the registration and drop/add periods, it's a good idea to check your schedule frequently to find out your position on the wait list. To find

out your wait-list position, you can:

- Call CU Connect and list your schedule by pressing **5#** (see the instructions on your registration form). If you are wait-listed for any courses, your wait-list position (normally current within the last 24 hours) will be announced when you list your schedule via CU Connect. Wait-list positions are normally updated nightly on CU Connect

- Or you can check your wait-list position via web registration. Log on to web registration and then click on the "schedule" tab at the bottom of the page. You'll be able to see your wait-list position for a course under "status" on the schedule page. Wait-list positions via web registration are updated in real time.

Placing your name on a wait list does not guarantee that you will be enrolled in that course, even if you're first on the wait list.

When a space opens up for you from a wait list, you are automatically enrolled in the class. *No verification is sent.* If you choose not to remain on a wait list or if you find that you have been enrolled in a course that you no longer want, *drop the course as soon as possible.*

**NOTE:** Wait-listed hours are included in your credit load limit (see page 37). You cannot be enrolled and wait listed for courses offered at the same time, and you cannot be wait listed for two courses offered at the same time.

**It is your responsibility to find out if you have been enrolled in a course from the wait list. If you do not attend a course you have been enrolled in, you will receive an F for that course.**

**DEADLINES FOR WAIT LISTS**

You may place your name on course wait lists through **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, January 26.** At that time, all wait lists will be frozen. This means you cannot add your name to a wait list after January 26 and *there is no automatic enrollment from wait lists after this date.*

If you are still on a wait list as of January 27 and are still interested in taking that course, check with the department offering the course. You must let the department know you are still interested in the course, should an opening occur. In that event, the department will give you a signed special action form to add the course. (**NOTE:** After January 26, you need the signature of the instructor on a special action form to add a course.) All department wait lists are canceled at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, February 4, the deadline to add a course without petitioning your dean.

**NOTE:** If you're on the wait list as of 5:00 p.m. on January 26, and you don't get enrolled in the course (undergraduate courses only), you'll be eligible to reserve the course the next time it is offered through the Course Reservation Program. (See page 38.)

**5 Receive Your Schedule/Bill**

You can receive your schedule/bill several different ways:

- If you register by December 28, your schedule/bill will be mailed to your permanent address by early January.
- If you make significant changes to your schedule or register after December 28, or need another copy of your schedule, you can get a printout of your schedule/bill in the **lobby of Regent** at the times listed below.

## 6 Drop/Add

You may make final adjustments to your schedule anytime after your drop/add time assignment begins through the add and drop deadlines.

Time assignments during the drop/add period are based on the last two digits of your student number. **You are not able to drop or add courses either through CU Connect, at a central drop/add site, or via web registration until your time assignment begins.** Time assignments are changed each semester to ensure fairness.

*To add a course after January 26 and through February 4 you must have the signature of your instructor on a special action form. In general, instructors will only approve an add if you've been regularly attending and there's space in the course.*

- **Deadline to Add Without Petitioning Your Dean** - The deadline to add a course without petitioning your dean is **5:00 p.m., Friday, February 4.** (NOTE: You must have instructor's signature on a special action form to add a course after January 26 and through February 4.)

*No adds are permitted after February 4 unless there are extenuating circumstances.*

**February 4 is also the deadline to change variable-credit hours, pass/fail, and no-credit status on courses.** These changes can be made at the registrar's office in Regent 105 through 5:00 p.m. on February 4.

**DEADLINES FOR DROPPING COURSES**

- **Drop Deadline** - The deadline to drop a course without the instructor's signature, without being assessed tuition and fees for that course, and without a *W* grade showing on your transcript is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, February 2.**

For courses dropped after Wednesday, February 2 (5:00 p.m.), no tuition and fee adjustments are made and you will receive a *W* grade on your transcript for dropped courses.

*To drop a course after February 2 and through March 1 you must be passing the course, and a special action form must be signed by your instructor and turned into the registrar's office.*

- **Deadline to Drop Without Petitioning Your Dean** - The deadline to drop a course without petitioning your dean is **5:00 p.m., Wednesday, March 1.**

After March 1 you cannot drop a course unless there are circumstances clearly beyond your control (accident, illness, etc.).

*To drop a course after this date you must have your dean's approval, as well as the approval of your instructor. Their signatures must be on a special action form or your request will not be processed.*



**Spring 2000 Course Fees**

Course fees are assessed to help offset the higher costs of specialized supplies, equipment, materials, and instructional and related support that are required to teach courses in certain departments. **NOTE:** 1999-2000 course fees are listed by each department in the course listings beginning on page 44. A list is also available at the Bursar's Office, and on the web.

**Enrollment Deposit**

Your \$200 enrollment deposit is held for you by the university until you:

- drop *all* classes in a semester within established dates and guidelines (see page 40), or
- officially withdraw within established dates and guidelines (see pages 39-40), or
- graduate.

At that time, the deposit is credited toward any outstanding financial obligations you may have, and a refund check is mailed to you within approximately eight weeks. Update your permanent address at the Office of the Registrar or the Bursar's Office before you graduate or withdraw to be sure you receive your refund. Interest earned from enrollment deposits is used for student financial aid.

*If you enroll at the university the semester following your graduation, your enrollment deposit remains on your account.* It is then refunded to you, in accordance with established university policy, when you are no longer enrolled.

**Residency**

Students classified as out-of-state residents who are seeking in-state tuition classification for spring 2000 should turn in residency petitions by **5:00 p.m., December 29, 1999**, to the Tuition Classification Office in Regent 1B54, Campus Box 68, Boulder, CO 80309-0068.

Petitions are accepted through January 21, 2000, but students who submit petitions after December 29 may not receive a decision by the tuition-payment deadline. Adjustments and reimbursements are made if a student's application is approved.

Students submitting a completed petition by November 1, 1999, receive a decision by the enrollment deposit refund deadline of January 7, 2000. Financial aid recipients seeking in-state classification should submit their petitions by November 1, 1999, to make sure their financial aid award is processed in time for spring semester.

### Student Health Insurance for Spring 2000

Students enrolled in 6 credit hours or more are **automatically charged for Plan B** of the student health insurance.

**OPTION B** - \$500 Deductible - \$50,000 Maximum per Illness or Injury. This option includes coverage for most WHC charges. It also provides worldwide coverage after the deductible and co-payment are met. When using a network health care provider other than WHC, the plan pays 80% for outpatient care, professional services, and inpatient hospitalization once the deductible is satisfied. Outside of the network the plan pays 60% of the allowable charges after the deductible is met. The 1999-2000 student health insurance policy booklet is available at WHC, which further describes benefits, co-payments, limitations, exclusions, and special provisions. Please note: Treatment outside of WHC requires a WHC referral. Benefits are unavailable without a WHC referral unless you meet the exceptions outlined in the policy booklet.

If you are taking 5 or fewer credit hours (this includes graduate students), or are enrolled in the ACCESS, Continuing Education, or Time Out program, the university-sponsored health plan is available at the same price that full-time students pay. You may also purchase insurance for your spouse or children. If you wish to enroll in the student health plan or you wish to enroll your spouse or dependents, you must sign up at WHC within the enrollment period, which is usually the first three weeks of the semester.

Students enrolled in correspondence courses are not eligible to enroll in the student insurance plan.

To become eligible to purchase the insurance, you must first pay full UCSU student fees. Exception: Approved doctoral candidates requesting student insurance are charged the full price for the insurance and UCSU student fees are reduced.

If you have at least a 20 percent appointment as a teaching, research, or graduate assistant or as a graduate part-time instructor, the university will contribute a portion of the cost toward either option A or B.

If you do not wish to be insured through the university-sponsored plan, you must submit a waiver/selection form to Wardenburg Health Center (WHC) or waive/select on line at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus> by January 26, 2000. If you wish to waive insurance, the selection/waiver form is required because you will be responsible for your own health care costs. The university is not responsible for your medical expenses.

A selection waiver form is not required in spring semester 2000 if you submitted one in fall semester 1999, unless you wish to change the insurance option for spring.

The selection/waiver form is a two-part form. Be sure to keep a copy for your files. If for some reason your form does not reach the University Health Insurance Department, your copy will be honored through April 15, 2000.

waive on the web by January 26, 2000, you have the opportunity to petition the Student Health Board Fee Waiver Committee. If the committee denies your petition, you may appeal the decision to the UCSU Appellate Court. The decision of the Appellate Court is final. If you are unsuccessful in your appeal, you must pay the student health insurance fee or be disenrolled from the university. The petition and appeal processes are available to you for the first two months of a semester only.

## Paying Your Bill

Any student who completes registration agrees to pay the University of Colorado at Boulder according to the payment terms documented in the *Registration Handbook and Schedule of Courses* under this section. Past due service charges of 1.5% per month are assessed for late payment. A financial stop is applied to the student record that will prevent registering for future terms, participating in class schedule adjustments (drop/add), receiving an academic transcript, and receiving a diploma. In addition, future term classes may be cancelled.

You may pay your bill by:

- **Cash** - All payments made by cash must be received at the cashier windows in the lobby of Regent.
- **Personal check, certified check, or cashier's check made payable to the University of Colorado** - If you pay by check, make sure your name and student number are on the check. Mail the check and the top portion of your bill to the Denver post office box noted on the bill, or use one of the tuition drop boxes at the north and south entrances of Regent. *Do not use campus mail.*

If you write a bad check (regardless of the amount) to the university, you may be subject to late charges and service charges, and a stop will be placed on your record. A \$17 returned-check charge is assessed, in addition to the amount due to the university. You may also be liable for collection costs and prosecution under the Colorado Criminal Statutes.

**The payment deadline is 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 26, 2000. Postmark dates are not honored. Credit cards are not accepted.**

**Do not include scholarship checks with your payment to the Bursar's Office.** Instead, forward the scholarship check to the Office of Financial Aid, Campus Box 106, Boulder, CO 80309-0106. If your scholarship check is not received in the financial aid scholarship office by the bill payment deadline, you are advised to make other arrangements to pay your bill to avoid late and service charges. The scholarship will be credited when it arrives and, in many cases, will generate a refund for you at the Bursar's Office.

If no specific instructions are provided by the donor, the financial aid office automatically divides private scholarships of \$500 or more equally between the fall and spring semesters. Private scholarships of less than \$500 will be applied in full to the current semester.

Scholarship checks should be made payable to the **University of Colorado** and sent to CU-Boulder, Scholarships, Campus Box 106, Boulder, CO 80309-0106.

**Original charges (less any adjustments) are always due on the first bill due date of the semester.** A second bill reflecting new charges (parking permit, classes added, etc.) will be mailed to your local mailing address February 8 and due on March 1. Call 303-938-8110 for your balance or check PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>. It is recommended that checks be written on a U.S. bank and in U.S. funds in order to avoid processing delays of up to three weeks and possible bank fees. If the delay extends beyond the tuition due date, late and service charges may be assessed.

**NOTE:** All checks containing restrictive endorsements are null and void and nonbinding on the university.

If you must send payments via express mail, send them to the Bursar's Office, Regent, Room 175, Boulder, CO 80309-0041.

**If you do not receive a tuition and fee bill, you are still responsible for knowing the amount of your bill and for paying it on time.** Call CU Connect at 303-938-8110, or call 303-492-5091 for your current balance, or access your current bill information on PLUS at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>.

The Bursar's Office hours from January 7 to January 21 are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (Tuesday, January 25, and Wednesday, January 26, until 6:00 p.m.). Refer to information included with your schedule/bill for extended hours of service.

The Bursar's Office offers personal assistance to Spanish-speaking students and students with a disability. If you need assistance, stop by the Bursar's Office, Regent, Room 150 or call 303-492-5381, or if deaf or hard of hearing, call 303-492-3528 (TTY).

## Tuition Payment Option: Deferred Tuition

By completing and returning the deferred tuition agreement located on the reverse side of your schedule/bill, you are allowed to pay one-half of the amount due on **January 26**. The minimum balance due, indicated on the reverse side of your bill, is reduced automatically by any credits (financial aid, insurance, RA/TA tuition waivers, and scholarships) applied after your bill is produced.

If the deferred tuition agreement is not part of your schedule/bill, you may also defer your tuition at the student billing windows in Regent from January 14 through January 26.

On **March 1**, you must pay the balance of your bill and a one-percent finance charge and any new charges added to your bill. A second bill reflecting this balance is mailed to your local mailing address on February 8. Make sure your address is current.

## Failure to Pay in Full by the Deadline

A **financial stop** will be placed on your record if you fail to pay your full tuition and fee bill by the published deadline.

This stop will prevent you from:

- registering for future terms
- participating in drop/add
- receiving an academic transcript
- receiving a diploma

In addition, if you are registered for a future term and a financial stop is added to your record, you are in risk of losing those classes.

**A late-payment charge, in addition to a service charge on the unpaid balance (one percent per month), is assessed according to the following schedule:**

All past due accounts are referred to the Student Debt Management (SDM) department for collection after the end of the semester. Past due service charges of 1.5% continue to accrue monthly as long as the debt is unpaid.

Colorado law requires the university to place all delinquent accounts with the state's Central Collection Services Office (CCS). The SDM department will place all delinquent accounts with CCS after one year, unless there exists a satisfactory repayment agreement including a signed contract with the Student Debt Management department in the Bursar's Office. CCS reports all past due accounts to national credit bureaus. Financial stops remain on your record until the balance is paid in full. Establishing a repayment agreement does not result in removal of stops.

### Getting Your Refund

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance, you are entitled to a refund. You can receive your refund either by:

- **Direct Deposit** - If you are currently enrolled for direct deposit, or sign up by December 17, and have a credit balance on your tuition account as of January 12, your spring 2000 refund will be deposited into your bank account on January 14. Throughout the semester, whenever your tuition account reflects a credit balance, your refund will be deposited to your bank account 24 hours after a credit balance appears on your tuition and fee account.

The university strongly encourages you to use this option. It insures safe and convenient payment of your refund.

For more information, or to sign up for this service, please call 303-492-5381 or 303-492-3528 (TTY), or stop by and fill out an application form.

- **Refund Checks** - If you do not sign up for direct deposit, and your tuition account reflects a credit balance as of December 27, a refund check will be mailed to your local mailing address on January 13. This refund **cannot** be picked up.

If your tuition account reflects a credit balance after December 27, a refund check will be available at the cashier's window in Regent beginning January 14. You must have your photo ID with you. Checks not picked up will be mailed to your local mailing address on a monthly basis throughout the semester.

### Financial Aid

Financial aid is generally awarded for the fall and spring terms, but students may apply for the spring term only using the *Free Application for Federal Student Aid* (FAFSA). Students are encouraged to apply by February 1 in order to complete the process by May 10, the last day of spring term. Applications are available from the Office of Financial Aid, Room 2, Environmental Design, or on the web at <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov>.

Financial aid funds include grants, scholarships, work-study and loan funds and are usually awarded based on financial need. Visit the the financial aid office, our home page at <http://www.colorado.edu/finaid>, or call 303-492-5091 and press 2 for further information. Financial aid funds are automatically applied to your bill and you will receive a refund if you have a credit balance.

### Short-Term Loans

Short-term loans up to \$500 are available to students during periods of enrollment and between fall and spring semesters. You must be at least eighteen years of age and enrolled at least half-time on the Boulder campus to qualify (ACCESS and Continuing Education students are not eligible), and you must present your photo ID. All loans must be backed by financial aid or have a co-signer.

### Veterans' Benefits

### Withdrawing and Financial Aid

The *Withdrawal Policy Regarding Tuition and Fees* states that students who pay their \$200 enrollment deposit and register for classes for any given semester are obligated to pay full tuition and fees for that semester unless they **officially withdraw** from the university. If you withdraw before the first day of classes, all financial aid will be cancelled.

If you begin classes at CU-Boulder, receive financial aid, and then withdraw, your financial aid will be adjusted according to federal regulations (34CFR668.22). The

Bursar's Office first calculates your tuition and fee charges according to your withdrawal date, and determines how much financial aid is to be retained to cover those charges. The Bursar's Office also determines allowable costs for books and supplies, living expenses, transportation, etc. based on the percentage of the semester completed at your date of withdrawal. If the financial aid you received exceeds your adjusted charges, excess funds must be "refunded" to the federal Title IV and other financial aid accounts. You will also be required to *repay* financial aid funds you received after your bill was paid if you received more than your allowable costs for living expenses, etc. The Office of Financial Aid is notified and adjustments are made to your financial aid award record.

There are three formulas that are used to determine the amount that needs to be refunded to federal Title IV or other financial aid accounts, and/or the amount to be repaid to the university. The formula that is most beneficial to the student will be used.

1. **Pro-Rata:** If you are a first-time student and you withdraw before 60 percent of the semester has passed, the Bursar's Office will calculate the "portion that remains" of the semester. They assess the amount of tuition and fees to be retrieved and calculate the amount of refund required for Title IV funds and other aid based on the percent of the semester you attended.

In the case of a prolonged illness, accident, death in the family, or other circumstances that make it impractical for you to complete the semester, the Bursar's Office will review the information you provide and will determine a settlement that is reasonable and fair to both you and the university.

## Refunds

If you received financial aid other than work-study, and the calculation results in a refund to Title IV and other financial aid accounts, we return funds to the accounts in the following order: Federal Direct Stafford/Ford Loan, (unsubsidized); Federal Direct Stafford/Ford Loan, (subsidized); Federal Direct PLUS (parent) loan; Federal Perkins Loan; Federal Pell Grant Program; Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG); Other Title IV programs; Institutional Aid; Colorado Athletic Scholarship; Diversity Grant; Graduate Need Grant; Undergraduate Merit; Colorado Extended Studies; Colorado Student Grant (CSG); private sources; student. The amount refunded to any program cannot be greater

than the amount awarded from that fund. Refunds are rounded up to the nearest dollar. If a refund is made to a loan program, you or your parent will receive simultaneous notice of the refund. If you petition the Bursar's Office for a different rebate period and your petition is granted, we will recalculate the refund to the financial aid accounts. Examples of refund calculations are available upon request from the Office of Financial Aid.

## Repayment

The following repayment policy is applied if you received financial aid for educational costs other than tuition and fees and then withdraw. Federal Direct Loans and work-study awards are excluded from this calculation.

To determine if you received an overpayment, we calculate the costs for your living expenses, travel, etc. (these are indirect education costs) for the time you were enrolled. If the refund check you received after your aid paid your bill (excluding direct loans) exceeds this calculated amount, you will be required to repay the difference to the university.

The portion of the refund you received that cannot be attributed to the cost of books and supplies, room and board, transportation, and medical expenses must be returned to the fund or funds from which it came. If you received aid from more than one fund, the overpayment will be returned to the funds in the order listed under "Refunds".

The Office of Financial Aid will return the amount calculated to the aid funds and then a bill will be created for you by the Bursar's Office. In the event that there is a balance due, your bill payments will be handled by the Bursar's Office.

## General Information

Many of the questions you may have about registration procedures are answered in this section.

## Addresses

The following addresses on your student record must be kept current:

- **Mailing address** (your address during the fall and spring semesters and during the summer months if you're enrolled in summer classes). Registration information for future semesters, outstanding tuition and fee bills, refund checks, and financial aid information are mailed to you at this address from late August through mid-May (and throughout the summer if you're enrolled in summer classes). **Exception:** Your permanent address is used during the winter semester break.

- **Permanent address** (considered your "home-base" address). It can be your parents' address, a Boulder address, or the address of someone who knows how to reach you. Schedule/bills are mailed to this address before the semester begins. This address is also used for mailings during the summer months and during the winter semester break. **Exception:** If you're enrolled in summer classes, your mailing address is used during the summer months.

Other offices, such as the library, housing, payroll, and

Wardenburg, have separate address systems and changes must be made there as well.

You can look up any of your addresses on the Personal Look-Up Services (PLUS) at <http://www.colorado.edu/plus> (see page 38) and, if needed, update your addresses via PLUS. Or you can fill out a change-of-address form at the Office of the Registrar in Regent 105, in the Office of Financial Aid in Environmental Design, room 2, or by calling 303-492-6970.

**NOTE:** The address that appears on your student record (and PLUS) also appears on the directory on CU-Boulder's home page on the web. When you make a change to any of your addresses, the change is normally updated on your student record within 24 hours. **Exception:** If you update your address via PLUS, your addresses are updated immediately (real-time). Addresses on the web directory are updated weekly.

### Advising

Check your invitation to register for advising requirements. If advising is required or if you wish to speak with an advisor:

- Arts and Sciences students - You are expected to meet with your primary advisor or faculty advisor prior to registering. Contact your advisor or department to arrange an advising conference. If you are an open option student or considering changing your major, contact the Advising Center, 303-492-7885 for an appointment. For arts and sciences advising information on the web, see <http://www.colorado.edu/ArtsSciences/overview/>.

- Engineering students - Call your faculty advisor, your major department, or your dean's office for advising.
- Students in any other college or school - Call your dean's office.

### Campus ID Card (Buff OneCard™)

The Buff OneCard™ is your official CU-Boulder student ID. It allows you access to the Student Recreation Center, campus libraries, meal plans, RTD buses, athletic events, residence halls, and anywhere else that official CU-Boulder identification is required.

The Buff OneCard™ Office is located in the lower level of the UMC. Office hours are Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Some form of picture ID is required in order to receive your initial Buff OneCard™, which is free to full-fee-paying students. There is a \$15 replacement fee for lost cards. To report a lost or stolen card, call 303-492-1212 immediately to avoid unauthorized use of your card in campus libraries or elsewhere for which you would be responsible. **DO NOT** share your Buff OneCard™ with anyone else.

**Buff Bucks** is the Buff OneCard™'s optional on-campus debit account. If you choose to activate this option, you can make purchases at a variety of campus merchants. You can deposit funds to your Buff Bucks account at the Buff OneCard™ Office or at Buff Bucks Transaction Machines located in the UMC, the Student Recreation Center, and Williams Village. You can store up to \$1000 in your Buff Bucks account. Since it is not a bank account, cash withdrawals cannot be made, and a fee is charged to close the account.

Through an agreement with the U of C Federal Credit Union, the Buff OneCard™ also offers the **Buff Gold** option. This option allows you to link your Buff OneCard™ with your Credit Union account to get cash from ATMs and to make debit card purchases from establishments that belong to the Star/Explore network (such as King Soopers and Safeway grocery stores). To activate this option, open a share draft account at the U of C Federal Credit Union, and request the Buff Gold option.

You may also elect to use your Buff OneCard™ as a **long distance calling card**. You will receive 10 free minutes of long-distance calls by calling with your authorization code and PIN. (If you are a residence hall student, direct dialing costs less than using the calling card.)

### Changing Your College or Major

If you want to transfer into another CU-Boulder college or school, check with the new dean's office for admission criteria and information on enrollment levels, application procedures, and deadlines. If you have already submitted an IUT (intrauniversity transfer) application, register as if you have been accepted into the new school or college.

**NOTE:** You may not be able to register for some courses until you have been accepted into your new school or

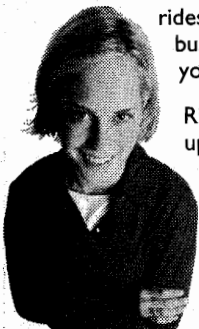

**NOTE:** If you are or will be receiving financial aid and are working on two majors (same degree) or a major and a minor and don't plan to graduate from both programs at the same time, your financial aid may be affected. ### Computer Labs

You can use any of ITS' or Housing's computing labs to access the Internet and register online. Labs are located in residence halls and other buildings across campus including Business, Clare Small Arts and Sciences, Duane Physics, Economics, Education, Ekeley Sciences, Engineering, Environmental Design, Fleming Law, Hellems, Macky, Muenzinger, and Norlin Library. ### Confidentiality of Student Records

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords you certain rights with respect to your education records. They are:

(1) The right to inspect and review your education records within 45 days of the day the university receives a request for access.

You should submit to the registrar, dean, head of the academic department, or other appropriate official, written requests that identify the record(s) you wish to inspect. The university official will make arrangements for access and notify you of the time and place where the records may be inspected. If the records are not maintained by the university official to whom the request was submitted, that official shall advise you of the correct official to whom the request should be addressed.

(2) The right to request the amendment of your education records that you believe are inaccurate or misleading.

You may ask the university to amend a record that you believe is inaccurate or misleading. You should write the university official responsible for the record, clearly identify the part of the record you want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading.

If the university decides not to amend the record as requested by you, the university will notify you of the decision and advise you of your right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to you when notified of the right to a hearing.

(3) The right to consent of disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in your education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

One exception which permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational

interests. A school official is a person employed by the university in an administrative, supervisory, academic or research, or support staff position (including law enforcement unit personnel and health staff); a person or company with whom the university has contracted (such as an attorney, auditor, or collection agent); a person serving on the Board of Regents; student worker; or a student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or one assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. In addition, your records may be disclosed to your parent(s) upon request if one of your parents claim you as a dependent for income tax purposes.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

Upon request, the university discloses education records without consent to officials of another school in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

(4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the university to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA is:

The following items of student information have been designated by the University of Colorado at Boulder as public or "directory" information: name, addresses, telephone numbers, e-mail address, dates of attendance, registration status, class, previous educational institutions attended, major field of study, awards, honors, degree(s) conferred, past and present participation in officially recognized sports and activities, physical factors (height, weight) of athletes, and date and place of birth. Such information may be disclosed by the institution at its discretion. Buff OneCard™ photos and numbers (not social security numbers) are not considered directory information but are shared with other campus departments and associates of the Buff OneCard™ program.

You have the right to withhold "directory information" from inquirers by selecting a "privacy" or "limited-privacy" option. The privacy option will prevent all directory and enrollment information from being released to all who do not have a clear educational interest for access to this information. The limited-privacy option will prevent the release of directory information to off-campus inquirers and to campus directory services, but is not as restrictive as the privacy option.

### Release of Disciplinary Information

Provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, as amended by the Higher Education Amendments of 1998, govern access to a student's disciplinary file. The student and/or those university officials who demonstrate a legitimate educational need for disciplinary information may have access to the student's



disciplinary file. Parent(s), who provide proof that a student is a dependent as defined in Section 152 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, i.e. a copy of the last federal income tax return listing the student as a dependent, can have access to the student's disciplinary file without written consent of the student. In this case, parents may also have access to a disciplinary file, even if the student has requested otherwise.

In addition, parent(s) may be notified if a student under 21 years of age is found responsible for a violation involving use or possession of alcohol and drugs.

The Campus Security Act permits higher education institutions to disclose to alleged victims of any crime of violence (murder, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, motor vehicle theft) the results of the conduct proceedings conducted by the institution against an alleged perpetrator with respect to such crime. The Campus Security Act also requires that both accused and the accuser be informed of campus conduct proceedings involving a sexual assault.

Additionally, the Higher Education Amendments of 1998 permit disclosure of the final results of disciplinary cases in which a student has been found responsible for a violation involving violence or for a sex offense.

### Credit-Hour Limits and Course-Load Definitions

**During the registration period**, undergraduate students can register for a maximum of 19 credit hours (15 credit hours for graduate students and 16 credit hours for law students), *including wait-listed courses*.

**During the final drop/add period**, undergraduates are allowed to register for up to 21 credit hours, *including wait-listed courses*. **NOTE:** A tuition surcharge is assessed for every credit hour added over 18.

For undergraduate students, 12 credit hours is considered a full-time load for financial aid and for enrollment verification purposes. Graduate students qualify for full-time status for enrollment verification purposes if they are enrolled for 5 or more hours or any number of thesis hours. Law students need 10 or more hours for full-time status. Check with the Office of Financial Aid for full-and part-time status definitions for graduate students.

### Credit and Grading Options

You can select or change the following credit and grading options via CU Connect and web registration through 5:00 p.m. on January 26 or at the registrar's office in Regent 105 through 5:00 p.m. on February 4. (*Important: Be sure to read the highlighted note below.*)

• **No Credit.** To register for a course on a no-credit basis, call CU Connect and select the no-credit option (see page 16), or select the no-credit option when registering via the web. You still pay full tuition for a no-credit course, but you do not receive a grade. An *NC* will appear on your transcript in place of a grade. Check with your college or school for policies on no-credit status and how it may be used.

**NOTE:** No-credit courses do not count toward full-time enrollment for financial aid purposes.

• **Pass/Fail.** Check with your college or school for the restrictions on the number and types of courses that can be taken pass/fail. To register for a course pass/fail, call CU Connect and select the pass/fail option (see page 16), or select the pass/fail option when registering via the web. Once you have signed up for a course on a pass/fail basis, it is *not* noted on class rosters or final-grade lists, nor should your instructor be notified that you are taking the course pass/fail. You are assigned a grade for the course. A grade of *D-* or above is converted to a *P*; an *F* remains an *F*. Only the *F* is calculated as part of your GPA; a grade of *P* is not counted.

**NOTE:** If you attempt to change the status of a course from or to P/F or NC by telephone or via the web, you will not be able to re-enroll in the course if it is closed or a wait list exists for the course. You can make this change without jeopardizing your enrollment in the course by filling out a credit-option form at the registrar's office in Regent 105.

• **Variable Credit.** All independent study courses and some regular courses are offered on a variable-credit basis (that is, they have a range of minimum and maximum credits). When you call CU Connect to register, or if registering for a variable credit course via the web, enter the number of credit hours you want to receive for the course when prompted. The number of credits can be changed throughout the registration and drop/add periods through 5:00 p.m., Friday, February 4.

### E-Mail the Registrar

Have you ever had an academic records-related or registration-related question but didn't know whom to ask? Or have you ever had a comment you wanted to share with us about one of our programs or processes?

E-mail the registrar's office at [registrar@colorado.edu](mailto:registrar@colorado.edu) to get some answers or make your comments. Your e-mail will be read by a staff member in the registrar's office and then forwarded to the appropriate person for a response.

### Grade Information

To obtain information about grades at the end of the semester:

• Call CU Connect, the telephone registration system, at 303-938-8110, during regular hours of operation (see page 16). When prompted to enter an application code, enter a "2" to access the grading application. You'll then need to enter the term code for the semester you want to access, followed by your student number and your PIN. Term codes consist of the last two digits in the year followed by one of these numbers:

- 1 = spring
- 4 = summer
- 7 = fall

For **spring semester 2000** grades (available beginning May 13), use the **term code 001**.

For **fall semester 1999** grades (available beginning December 22), use the **term code 997**.

- Look up your grades on PLUS on the World Wide Web, <http://www.colorado.edu/plus>. Fall semester 1999 grades will be available on PLUS beginning December 22.
- Check to see if your grades are posted, as some instructors post grades for their courses outside of their offices, the classroom, or the departmental office.
- Order official transcripts by:
  - mailing a signed written request to Transcripts, Campus Box 68, University of Colorado, Boulder, CO 80309-0068
  - sending a signed FAX request to 303-492-4884
  - calling in a request to 303-492-8987

The above methods for ordering official transcripts are free of charge and are normally processed (mailed 1st Class) within four business days.

There are two additional methods available for ordering an official transcript. Both are available 24 hours/day by a third party provider, VOICE FX. You may either call 1-800-613-3735 or contact them by web at <http://www.gettranscript.com> and select the University of Colorado, Boulder. Transcripts through this service cost \$1.50 each. These are normally processed (mailed 1st Class) within four business days.

- Order an unofficial transcript for a cost of \$1 (next-day service) or \$5 (same-day service) at the transcript window, Regent lobby, or by calling **303-492-8987**. Unofficial transcripts are not mailed off campus.

## Graduation

If you plan to graduate within the next year, you must check with your dean's office for graduation application deadlines and notification procedures.

Graduating students with Federal Perkins/NDSL loans must complete a loan exit interview before leaving the university.

**NOTE:** If you are or will be receiving financial aid and are working on two majors (same degree) or a major and a minor and don't plan to graduate from both programs at the same time, your financial aid may be affected. For more information, contact the Office of Financial Aid in the lower level of Environmental Design, or call 303-492-5091.

## Other Registration Programs

A number of different registrations are held each semester for specific categories of students. If you have questions about any of these registrations, call the number listed in that section or see the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog*.

## ACCESS Registration

Nondegree students (students not currently enrolled in a degree program at CU-Boulder) may take Boulder campus courses through the ACCESS (Available Credit Courses for Eligible Special Students) Program. Register through CU Connect, web registration, or in person at the

Continuing Education Office, 1505 University, beginning Friday, January 14. For information on registration eligibility and times for registration, please call 303-492-5148 or visit the ACCESS web site at <http://www.colorado.edu/conted/access.htm>.

**NOTE:** Nondegree out-of-state students who want to register for 3 credit hours or less through ACCESS are assessed a rate less than the regular out-of-state tuition rate.

### Concurrent Registration

If you plan to take at least one course at CU-Boulder in the fall and cannot register for all courses required for your degree program, you may be able to register concurrently on another CU campus. The course(s) must be required for your degree program, you must have your dean's permission, and enrollment levels must not have been reached on the other campus. Graduate students must have their advisor's approval. If all these conditions are met, you may register on another CU campus for up to two courses or 6 credit hours, whichever is greater.

You cannot register concurrently until the final drop/add period has begun on the other campus. Boulder students pay Boulder tuition rates for all courses.

Concurrent registration forms and instructions are available at the registrar's office in Regent 105 beginning January 4. For information, call 303-492-8494.

**Note to Graduate Students:** Check with the Office of the Registrar for exceptions to the home-campus registration requirement and limitation on credit hours at the host campus.

### Course Reservation Program

The Course Reservation Program assists you in getting the courses you need to graduate by giving you an opportunity to reserve space in a course and enroll in that course for the next semester before the next registration period begins. All undergraduate courses offered at CU-Boulder that use wait lists, except for controlled enrollment courses, are included in the Course Reservation Program.

You are eligible to participate in the Course Reservation Program for *fall semester 2000* if your name is on a wait

list for a course as of 5:00 p.m. on January 26 (the wait list deadline), and you don't get enrolled in the course.

**NOTE:** This applies only to course wait lists on the Student Information System (SIS), not wait lists that may be kept manually by a department.

If you are on a course wait list as of 5:00 p.m. on January 26 and don't get into the class, you should plan to come into the registrar's office, Regent 105, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., **March 20-30** to register for the course for fall 2000. Registrations will *not* be honored through the Course Reservation Program after March 30. In addition, all restrictions are honored, and you must clear up any "stops" before registering. You will register for all other fall 2000 courses during your regular registration time assignment.

### Faculty and Staff Registration

All permanent faculty and staff members at CU-Boulder may take 1 to 6 credit hours each year without paying tuition. Course work must be taken outside of scheduled working hours or an adjusted work schedule must be established that is acceptable to the employing department. For more information, call 303-492-5381.

### High School Concurrent Program

The High School Concurrent Program is coordinated by the Division of Continuing Education. Registration is available through the ACCESS and Boulder evening programs. For information on eligibility and times for registration using CU Connect or web registration, please call 303-492-5148 or visit the High School Concurrent web site at <http://www.colorado.edu/conted/hsconcur.htm>.

### Intercampus Registration

If you want to take course work on another University of Colorado campus but not go through the concurrent registration program, apply for admission to that campus and follow its registration procedures. Check with your dean's office for approval. (Students in the College of Arts and Sciences may not register at the Denver or Colorado Springs campus except in the summer.)

### Late Registration

To be guaranteed enrollment for spring 2000, you must complete registration by **6:00 p.m. on January 13**. If you do not register by the deadline (this includes graduate students), you are subject to late registration. Only students in open categories are eligible for late registration. In addition, a lower registration priority and a **\$50 late fee** are applied.

If you are a continuing student, call 303-492-6970 on January 14 to see if you are eligible for late registration. If you are a new or readmitted student, go to Admissions Operations in Regent 1B65 (303-492-2451) to check for eligibility. Students who are eligible for late registration must go to the registrar's office in Regent 105, or Regent 1B60 to set up for late registration.

### Parking Permits and Bicycle Registration

To buy a **parking permit**, you must bring a photo ID and a valid state motor-vehicle registration form. The costs for an academic year permit (August - May) are: \$162, \$216, \$261, and \$270. Semester rates are: \$81, \$108, \$130.50 and \$139. Motorcycle permits cost \$27 per semester or \$54 for academic year (all prices are subject to change). You can pay with cash, check, credit card (Visa, MasterCard, American Express), or charge it to your tuition and fee bill.

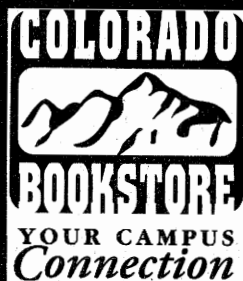

## Time Out Program

The Time Out Program (TOP) provides an opportunity for you to take a leave from the university for a semester or a year without losing your place in your current college or school. You must be in good academic standing and have your dean's approval. Readmission to the university is guaranteed when you return, providing you meet registration and deposit deadlines. A nonrefundable \$40 application fee is charged. The TOP application deadline for spring semester is **March 1**. More information is available from the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105, 303-492-8673.

## Withdrawal Procedures

If you need to withdraw from all of your courses for spring semester 2000, you can fill out a withdrawal form in the registrar's office or write a letter to the Withdrawal Coordinator, Office of the Registrar, Campus Box 7, Boulder, CO 80309-0007. (Exception: Nondegree students withdraw through Continuing Education, 1505 University Ave., Campus Box 178, Boulder, CO 80309-0178.) If you write a letter of withdrawal please be sure to include your name, student ID number, the semester from which you want to withdraw, and your signature. For questions or more information about the withdrawal process, visit or call the Office of the Registrar, Regent 105, 303-492-8673.

You need not drop your courses; this is done for you.

**NOTE:** If you drop all your courses and don't re-register for courses, you are considered withdrawn from the university and you should notify the registrar's office.

If you are registered for courses and do not officially withdraw from the university by contacting the registrar's office, failing grades are recorded for all of your courses. **Remember:** Deadlines and rules for withdrawing may vary within each college and school. Check with your dean's office concerning withdrawal rules.

**NOTE:** If you withdraw from CU-Boulder but plan to return to the Boulder main campus in the future, you must either go on the Time Out Program (see page 39) or reapply through the Office of Admissions. (Students remaining enrolled in only Continuing Education classes must still either reapply or go on TOP to return to Boulder main campus.)

Tuition assessments for students with financial aid may differ from those listed on this page. Please check with the Bursar's Office at (303) 492-5381. If deaf or hard of hearing, call (303) 492-3528 (TTY).

Withdrawing students (including students applying for the Time Out Program) with Federal Perkins/NDSL loans must complete a loan exit interview before leaving the university. Failure to do so will result in a stop on your record. This stop will prevent you from receiving a diploma or an academic transcript of work at the university and from registering for any future terms. In order to complete a loan exit interview, contact the Student Loan Department in the Bursar's Office at 303-492-5571. If deaf or hard of hearing, call 303-492-3528 (TTY).

## REFUND OR ASSESSMENT SCHEDULE

Full refund of the \$200 enrollment deposit (*continuing students only*). **Note:** The deadline to withdraw and receive a deposit refund also applies to students planning to go on the *Time Out Program*. *New, readmitted, and transfer students are not eligible for a refund.*

\$200 in tuition and fees is assessed. (The enrollment deposit is applied to this charge.) **Note:** *Nondegree students are not assessed a financial penalty if they withdraw by February 2.*

40% of full tuition and fees\* is assessed, or the \$200 enrollment deposit, whichever is greater.

## About Course Listings

### Understanding Course Numbers

Courses are numbered according to the following guidelines:

1000-2999	Lower-division courses
3000-4999	Upper-division courses
5000-5999	Courses intended for graduate students and qualified undergraduates
6000-8999	Courses open to graduate students only

Enrollment in courses with a 700-, 800-, or 900-level section number is controlled by each department. The department staff either gives you the five-digit course call number so you can register for the course either via CU Connect or via web registration, enrolls you in the course directly on the computer, or gives you a special action form to take to a central drop/add site (during the final drop/add period *only*) or to the registrar's office.

### Understanding Course Listings

The headers at the top of each column of the course listings include:

**Core Diamonds**—A diamond (♦) appears to the left of courses that fulfill a College of Arts and Sciences core curriculum requirement. (Refer to the College of Business Degree Requirements brochure for information on courses that fulfill the College of Business core curriculum requirements.)

**Course Title**—Often abbreviated; refer to the *University of Colorado at Boulder Catalog* for the complete title and course description.

**Section Number**—This three-digit number refers to the specific meeting pattern of the course. The three-digit number alone is the lecture number. When an R, L, P, or S precedes the section number, it indicates that the section is a recitation (R), a laboratory (L), a practicum (P), or a studio (S), which must be taken in addition to the lecture. Some courses may have three: lecture, lab, and recitation.

**Call Number**—The five-digit number, specific to a particular term, that is used for requesting a specific section of a course via CU Connect and via web registration.

**Time/Days**—Meeting time and days of the class (M—Monday; T—Tuesday; W—Wednesday; R—Thursday; F—Friday; S—Saturday; and U—Sunday).

**Building/Room**—The building name and room number where the class meets; this is subject to change. (See this page and the next for the building abbreviations.)

**Maximum Enrollment**—The maximum number of students allowed to enroll in the course.

**Notes**—When a course has a prerequisite and/or a corequisite, a note (*in italics*) appears just after the course title. Additional course notes are inserted into each course listing, as needed.

**Remember:** Some courses may not be available to you due to college or school restrictions or class size limitations. In this case, CU Connect and web registration will inform you with an appropriate message.

**Department Headings**—These will include the phone number and the department location.

The core curriculum must be satisfied by all students in the College of Arts and Sciences who began their undergraduate study in the summer of 1988 or later. Those students who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must also meet the college's minimum academic preparation standards, or MAPS (see page 120). You must take one course per MAPS deficiency per term. **Please note the following change in policy: If you complete a course approved to fulfill a MAPS deficiency and that course also is approved to fulfill a Core area, that course can be used to fulfill both the Core requirement and the MAPS deficiency. This change in policy applies to all Arts and Sciences students who are subject to MAPS. Please contact your academic advisor for additional information.**

There are eleven requirements of the core curriculum—four in skills acquisition and seven in the content areas of study. The requirements are all listed here, with instructions and lists of courses that will fulfill each requirement. For a complete explanation of graduation requirements in the College of Arts and Sciences, see the University of Colorado Catalog.

Selected majors are exempt from portions of the core curriculum (see sections 6, 8, 9 and 10 of the content areas of study). Content area exemptions may be used cumulatively if you are graduating with more than one eligible major.

Although a single course may appear in several areas, you may use it to meet only one core requirement.

### Skills Acquisition

#### 1. Foreign Language

While in high school, all students are required to demonstrate third-level proficiency in a single modern or classical foreign language. If you have not met this requirement at the time you enter the college, you are required to meet the deficiency by passing an appropriate third-semester college course or by passing a CU-Boulder-approved equivalency examination. **Minimum Academic Preparation Standards**

All new students entering the University of Colorado who finished high school in the spring of 1988 or later must meet the Minimum Academic Preparation Standards (MAPS) specified by their school or college. The purpose of these standards is to assure that all students have some core knowledge in common.

The College of Arts and Sciences has adopted the following standards for admissions. These standards are defined in high school years.

- English** 4 high school years (including 2 in composition)
- Mathematics** 3 high school years (2 in algebra and 1 in geometry)
- Natural Science** 3 high school years (including 2 in lab science, one of which must be chemistry or physics)
- Social Science** 3 high school years (including one of U.S. or world history and one of geography. A student who has U.S. history may use 1/2 year of world history and 1/2 year of geography instead of one year of geography.)
- Foreign Language** completion of a third-year-level course (level III) in a high school foreign language sequence

**Policies Concerning the Completion of MAPS**

If you were admitted to the College of Arts and Sciences with missing MAPS courses, you are subject to the following policies:

1. Each year of missing high school work can be made up by one semester of appropriate CU-Boulder course work.
2. All course work taken toward fulfillment of the MAPS must be taken for a letter grade, and you must receive a passing grade.
3. You are required to enroll in and complete at least one MAPS course each term, beginning in your first term of enrollment, until such time as all MAPS requirements are completed. This policy applies to new freshmen, transfer students, and students transferring from other colleges or schools on the Boulder campus and from other campuses of the University. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in suspension at the end of the term in which you cease to complete missing MAPS courses.
4. All students who first enroll in one college or school at CU-Boulder and who subsequently transfer to another college or school are required to meet the MAPS specified for the new college or school, whether or not they have completed their MAPS courses in their previous college or school.
5. Double-degree students must meet MAPS requirements of both degree-granting colleges or schools.
6. During the arts and sciences orientation, students must consult with a CU-Boulder academic advisor to determine which specific courses may be used to meet a MAPS requirement.
7. Please note the following change in policy: If you complete a course approved to fulfill a MAPS deficiency and that course also is approved to fulfill a Core area, that course can be used to fulfill both the Core requirement and the MAPS deficiency.
